Because Briarcrest Christian School is committed to the teachings and principles of the Bible, its Board of Trustees and its Personnel (for purposes of this Code, Personnel means the Administrative Staff, the Faculty and all other individuals, whether employees or volunteers, who are required to affirm their commitment to the School's Mission Statement, Vision Statement, and Doctrinal Statement) must be held to a higher standard of conduct. It is understood that there must be a direct relationship between what the Board of Trustees and BCS Personnel believe and the way that the Board of Trustees and BCS Personnel behave. While it is hoped that the Board and BCS Personnel will voluntarily refrain from any illegal, unethical, or immoral acts that would bring disgrace to their fellow workers, embarrassment to the school, or reproach to the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, employment/service at BCS is undergirded by the admonition to conduct oneself in accord with the teachings of Jesus Christ, to abide by rules relating to Christian behavior, and to subscribe to the Mission Statement, Vision Statement, and Doctrinal Statement as a condition of service.

The tenets contained in the Professional Code of Conduct are intended to define the high behavioral standards that can reasonably be expected when parents entrust their children to leaders of a Christian school.

The Board and BCS Personnel will:

- not engage in acts of immorality (e.g., adultery, fornication, homosexuality, cohabitation that Briarcrest would reasonably perceive as being sexual in nature, or other perversions of biblical sexuality). [1 Corinthians 6:9-10, Hebrews 12:16]
- not profess to be or practice as a transgender or express the non-biblical belief that being transgender is acceptable. [Matthew 19:4-6, Genesis 1:27, Deuteronomy 22:5]
- not engage in acts of profanity or obscenity, either in word or deed [Matthew 15:18-19, Ephesians 4:29]
- not use, sell, or distribute illegal drugs or abuse prescription drugs [Romans 13:1-2, 1 Corinthians 6:19]
- not use tobacco or consume alcohol at any school-related function, regardless of his/her personal beliefs or preference, and will not assert his/her "liberty" to partake of these substances when it is probable that a member of the Briarcrest Christian School community, perhaps holding contrary views, would resent and be offended [Ephesians 5:18, 1 Corinthians 8:9]
- not frequent establishments of questionable moral/ethical reputation, to include places where gambling, "adult entertainment," or other places where the propriety of attendance would be questioned of one who is serving as a Christian role model to children [1 John 2:16, 1 Corinthians 15:33]
- not initiate a divorce proceeding against his/her spouse except for reasons of adultery or abandonment, or remarry unless consistent with Scriptural principles [Matthew 5:32, 1 Corinthians 7:10-15]
- not directly or indirectly counsel, cause or facilitate the abortion of a preborn baby unless, in the opinion of a doctor who is not primarily in the business of performing abortions, such a procedure is necessary to save the life of the mother [Jeremiah 1:5, Psalm 139:13-16]
- not, either as an individual or a member of a group, engage in activities that might be viewed as divisive, professionally or ethically questionable, or harmful to the ministry of the school, including participating in any groups or organizations whose beliefs are contrary to the Mission Statement of the school, Vision Statement of the school, or the Doctrinal Statement of the school [Romans 15:5, 1 Corinthians 1:10].

Violation of any provision of the Professional Code of Conduct will jeopardize the employment or volunteer relationship and may result in censure, probation, or termination.

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Each member of the Briarcrest Christian School ("Briarcrest") faculty and staff is a minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ and should support, uphold and advance the principles articulated in Briarcrest's Mission Statement, Vision Statement, Doctrinal Statement, Biblical Principles Policy and the tenets articulated in the Professional Code of Conduct and other conduct and discipline provisions of the Employee Manual (collectively "Statements"). These Statements are available for your review either online or in the Employee Manual, a copy of which is available in each administrative office.

As part of their ministry, members of the faculty and staff are expected to mentor students by word and deed, leading students toward Christian maturity and teaching in a manner consistent with the demands of their respective academic or other disciplines and the principles of the Statements.

As ministerial personnel, faculty and staff members must demonstrate the following characteristics:

Knowledge: faculty and staff members must demonstrate familiarity with the meaning, foundation, and ethical implications of the Statements.

Alignment: faculty and staff members must teach students in a manner that is consistent with the mission and messages of Briarcrest, in accordance with its Statements. They must conduct themselves in a manner that communicates the mission and messages with integrity.

Skill: faculty and staff members must effectively communicate Briarcrest's faith-based messages to students and to other members of the Briarcrest community and may be called upon to lead Bible studies, prayer, worship, and to train students in the foundations of the Statements.

In the event of a dispute regarding the meaning of the Statements or their applicability to any given moral, theological, or cultural question, such dispute shall be resolved by the President, and his or her interpretation shall be given controlling authority.

Members of the faculty and staff who are unwilling or unable to perform the ministerial functions outlined above may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.

Members of the faculty and staff who have signed this form, but later have a change of belief that would no longer allow them to comply with these obligations as ministerial personnel, must immediately make the President aware of their change of belief and submit their resignation.
