





- Advanced Placement courses are designed by the College Board organization to offer rigorous and challenging curriculum ar the college level.
- An exam produced by the College Board is given in each class at the end of the year.
- Each exam is given a score from 1-5.




The advantages of taking AP classes and exams

- To provide challenging coursework that helps students reach their potential
- To prepare students for the college-level workload and develop college-level academic skills
- To earn credit for college courses
 - Many colleges provide college credit for achieving certain scores on AP exams. The score requirements for credit vary according to university policies.
- To save time and money in college



The advantages of taking AP classes and exams

- To provide evidence of "Academic Rigor" which is part of the college admission and scholarship process
 - Colleges want to see that students are embracing challenging courses for admission and scholarship purposes
- To boost GPA—2 GPA points are provided in AP courses
 - If a student earns an 80 in the course, that is translated as a 3.0 GPA. With the additional points added, the GPA for that course is 5.0
- To receive merit-based financial aid based on specific university merit-based scholarship offerings

- 2. Check prerequisites
- 3. Provide needed information and signatures
 - Signatures should be included from a student's current teacher in that discipline as well as the current AP teacher of the course
- 4. Provide other requested information (research paper grade, course grade, writing sample)
- 5. Students can ask their current teachers to determine what courses are best for them for next year.



Important information about Advanced Placement classes and testing

Students must make a final grade of 80 or above in the AP class to sit for the AP exam. Students making a 79 or below will not sit for the AP exam but will take an equivalent final exam.

• Students will be billed \$50 for each AP class through FACTS in September. Students will be billed an additional \$65 in Spring for each AP test. This covers all testing expenses.
