Academic Diploma with Honors Endorsement Requirements:

- 24 credits
- Seven-semester weighted GPA of 3.8 in grades 9-12
- 6 credits in Honors and/or Advanced Placement courses from the BCS core classes of: English, Science, Math, Social Studies, World Languages or Bible.



Academic Diploma with Fine Arts Endorsement:

- 24 credits in grades 9-12
- 5 credits in fine/performing arts
- Seven semester weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher.



Academic Diploma with Fine Arts and Honors Endorsement Requirements:

- 24 credits in grades 9-12
- 6 credits in Honors and/or Advanced Placement courses
- 5 credits in fine/performing arts and
- Seven-semester weighted GPA of 3.8 or higher.

Advanced Placement

 These are college level courses offered through the College Board organization.

- AP courses are taken for potential college credit
 - Tests are scored on a 1-5 scale.
 - AP Tests with scores of 3 or higher may be awarded credit by the college the student has chosen. Different universities have different requirements for awarding credit.

Dual Enrollment –

- Dual Enrollment courses are offered to juniors and seniors who meet specific academic criteria.
- Students must be a resident of TN in order to receive the grant money to pay for the college tuition.
- BCS partners with The University of Memphis to offer dual enrollment.
- Participating students can earn both a high school credit and college hours for the courses. No end of the year test is required.
- Students may receive college credit for dual enrollment courses.
 This will be determined by the college where your student enrolls.

• Honors Latin I, Honors Spanish I, and Honors French I taken in the 8th grade may be used to satisfy the credits required for the Honors Endorsement only.

• The courses are listed on the BCHS transcript, but they are not in the GPA.




